



Resolution 96.10.4 – Policy 3000 (New Admissions Procedure):

NEW BUSINESS A. Review of final draft of Admission Procedure 3000.

Mary Lou Locke distributed this DRAFT and referred to a memo about new admissions procedures and Policy 3000 and explained the current procedures for admittance under different admissions standards. Students need guidance about what courses to take to meet their goals and the need for minimum qualifications. Another goal of this procedure was to permit us to track students in order to help retention. The Counseling Department is now working to come up with concrete criteria for re-admission. For re-admission the second time, there will be a District committee to review students' petitions.

Senator Chris Dawes expressed a concern that any disqualification criteria be made very clear to students.

B. Review of Credit/No-Credit 12 unit limitation. Mary Lou Locke explained that this came up to the district Student Services Council.
