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Resolution 09.03.09 - Mailing of the Summer Class Schedule Resolution

Whereas, in response to the budget crisis in the State of California, the district and colleges have taken drastic cost cutting steps, including the reduction of class sections, the reduction of classified hourly workers, the reduction of hours of operations, and

Whereas, the printing and mailing of over 400,000 class schedules for summer alone cost over \$150,000 which is equivalent to about 37 class sections, and

Whereas, a supply of printed schedules would still be available at colleges and appropriate community sites, and

Whereas, Faculty, staff, students and the general public have questioned the continued practice of mailing the class schedule, and the District Combo Schedule Committee on February 27th unanimously recommended that the summer schedule not be mailed this year, be it

Resolved, that both the Academic and Classified Senates urge the District not to mail summer 2009 class schedules and to find other methods of marketing the schedule of courses to continuing and new students. Be it further

Resolved, that data be collected to determine the impact of this change with the intention of discontinuing the practice of mailing schedules for the duration of this economic crisis.
