1. **CALL TO ORDER/INTRODUCTIONS:** The meeting was called to order at 7:21 a.m. Introductions were made.
2. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES:** Minutes from Tuesday, March 13 were reviewed. Mark motioned for approval of the minutes, Mandy seconded the motion, 5 ayes and one abstention. Minutes approved.
3. **FIRST YEAR CLASS STATUS:** Amanda Johnston provided the following statistics for the first year class:
 - a. 29 students, average age is 29.4(13males, 16 females)
 - b. Ethnic Identification: Hispanic/Latino 10, Asian 6, White 8, two or more races 4 and other 1.
 - c. Education Background: AS 8, Bachelor's 11, certificate 1, other 1
 - d. Enrolled: 13 units to include Intro to PT (Johnston), Documentation and Med Term.(Balderas), Human Movements(Johnston), Acute Care (Fischer) and Acute Care Lab(Fischer and Garrett) and Growth and Development(Hybrid - Garrett).
- **SECOND YEAR CLASS STATUS:** Amanda Johnston provided the following statistics for the second year class:

- a. 24 students (11males, 13 females), average age 29.5, 1 student left for personal reasons
- b. Ethnic Identification: Hispanic/Latino 12, Asian 8, White 4, Two or more races 1
- c. Education Background: AS 3, Bachelor's 13,1 Masters, 1other(EMT)
- d. Enrolled: 8-11 units: Modalities (Hybrid-Smith), Modalities Lab (Smith and Balderas) 8 week 1; Ortho (Sanders) Ortho Lab (Sanders and Johnston); 8 week 2: First DCP (291)(Balderas)

- **PROGRAM STATUS/ACCREDITATION:**

- **CAPTE:** Mandy reported we received our response for our compliance report at the end of May and received our 10 year accreditation. Next self-study and site visit will be Spring 2027. Compliance report consisted of providing proof of meeting (minutes)between faculty, didactic courses, clinical education, and program assessment information, advisory meeting minutes, admissions process, and clarification of syllabi processes. Mandy has created a template for faculty to assist with being consistent that has been very helpful. Thank you everyone for your support.

- **DIRECTED CLINICAL PRACTICE:**

- **Sites/Students' Status:** 9 students went out this summer for either an Acute Care or Rehab rotation. Positive feedback from both the students and their Clinical Instructors.
Fall 2018: 9 Acute/SNF/Rehab and 7 OP. Per State Mandate of 50 hrs=1 unit it is now a 3 unit course of 144-162 hours.
Spring 1 2019: 17 sites, need 7 additional sites. Hoping Scripps will be done with EMR transition and be able to take students.
Spring 2 2019: 16 sites, need 8 additional sites.
 New hours are 240-270 hrs and now 5 unit courses each.

Feedback CI's: Documentation in all settings more rigourous and needs to tie to functional outcomes. By end of 1st clinical rotation students documentation is good. Feel our students are very professional, coming early, studying for next day's patient load, taking initiative.

Feedback Students: Loved summer rotation. More hands on with clinicians, will be doing an Acute Care Workshop on 9/24 from 5:30-7:30 p.m and currently has 8

clinicians volunteering. Tina has implemented more lines and using middle bed for practicals based on student feedback.

Penny Anders discussed the mentoring at Sharp of new grad seems to be excessive. Wondering rationale of hovering when new grad was from our program and has passed all her competencies. Tabitha mentioned it is a Sharp policy as part of their mentoring program.

Mark Eckert says they come very prepared and confident with techniques in his OP setting. Could work on their communication and interpersonal skills to feel comfortable talking with patients of different ages.
