Associated Students (A.S.) Academic Achievement, Leadership, and Service Award

This scholarship is funded by the San Diego Mesa College Associated Students to recognize deserving Mesa College students who have achieved outstanding scholarship, leadership, and services.

There are three categories of scholarship:

- a. Academic
- b. Leadership
- c. Community Service

These scholarship categories are open to all qualified students except A.S. Officers.

An eligible student may apply for more than one scholarship category (Academic Achievement, Leadership, **or** Community Service). He/she may

receive **no more than one** scholarship. The highest monetary amount of each of the Associated Students (A.S.) scholarships will be awarded.

A. Associated Students Academic Achievement Scholarship

The Associated Students scholarship fund was established by the San Diego Mesa College Associated Students in the Fall 2000 to recognize and provide financial assistance to students who have current Associated Students (A.S.) membership and who have excelled academically.

Associated Students (A.S.) officers (elected/appointed) are not eligible to apply.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a Mesa College/SDCCD grade point average of 3.0 or higher
- Have declared academic goal: A.A./A.S. Degree, Career Education, or Transfer
- Have an A.S. membership for Spring 2009

B. Associated Students Community Service Scholarship

The Associated Students scholarship fund was established by the San Diego Mesa College Associated Students in the Fall 2000 to recognize and provide financial assistance to students who have current Associated Students (A.S.) membership and who have made contributions to the community through community service.

Associated Students (A.S.) officers (elected/appointed) are not eligible to apply.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Have **completed** a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a Mesa College/SDCCD grade point average of 2.5 or higher
- Have declared academic goal: A.A./A.S. Degree, Career Education, or Transfer
- Have a verifiable community service record
- Have current A.S. membership for Spring 2009

C. Associated Students Leadership Scholarship

The Associated Students scholarship fund was established by the San Diego Mesa College Associated Students in the Fall 2000 to recognize and provide financial assistance to students who have current Associated Students (A.S.) membership and who have achieved outstanding leadership.

Associated Students (A.S.) officers (elected/appointed) are not eligible to apply.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a Mesa College/SDCCD grade point average of 2.5 or higher (semester gpa and cum gpa)
- Have declared academic goal: A.A./A.S. Degree, Career Education, or Transfer
- Have a verifiable leadership record
- Have a Current A.S. membership for Spring 2009

Academic Senate Scholarship Award

This scholarship fund was established by the Faculty of San Diego Mesa College Academic Senate to recognize and provide assistance to deserving students who are pursuing Education (child development, elementary, secondary, or post-secondary) as a career.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed

Alfonso Perez Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by Mesa College's Vice President of Administration Ron Perez and family in loving memory of their father, and Lupe Perez's husband. Alfonso Perez was a career union electrician with IBEW Local 569 and believed that education was a key to success and instilled this value in his children. This scholarship provides financial assistance to a deserving student who has overcome obstacles to pursue an education.

To be eligible, a student must meet the following criteria:

- Completed at least 12 units at Mesa College
- Demonstrated a GPA of at least 3.0
- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Have demonstrated community involvement
- Have demonstrated financial need

Allen L. Rogert Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by Sybil Rogert, Professor of Mathematics, in memory of her husband, Allen Lee Rogert. This scholarship was established to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student who is a Mathematics student.

To be eligible, a student must meet the following criteria:

- Current enrollment in at least 8 units at Mesa
- Current enrollment in Math class at Mesa beyond Math 96
- Math GPA of at least 3.0
- Completed of at least 12 units at Mesa College
- Demonstrated academic success with an overall GPA of at least 3.0
- You are ineligible if you have received this scholarship

Animal Health Technology

This scholarship fund was established by the faculty of San Diego Mesa College's Animal Health Technology Department, San Diego County Veterinary Medical Association, and other private donors to recognize and provide financial assistance to students majoring in Animal Health Technology who have achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and a cumulative GPA of 3.0 higher
- Have a declared major in Animal Health Technology

Asian Pacific American Studies

This scholarship is intended to encourage leadership/community services related to Asian Pacific Americans at Mesa College or in the Asian Pacific American Community.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have completed one of the following or is currently enrolled in English 230, Filipino Studies 100, History 123, Personal Growth 127 (Personal Growth utilizing materials from an Asian Pacific American perspective).
- Have a SDCCD/Mesa College grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Have leadership/community service related to Asian Pacific Americans at Mesa College or in the APA community

Beta Beta Upsilon Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa Community Service Sch.

This scholarship fund is established by Beta Beta Upsilon Chapter of Phi Theta

Kappa Honor Society to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving member of the chapter who is actively involved in community service/volunteer work.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be a full member of Beta Beta Upsilon Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa at San Diego Mesa College (Having a GPA of 3.5 or higher)
- Student must be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Student must have a declared academic goal: A.A/A.S. Degree, Career Education, or Transfer Studies
- **If** student has accepted a PTK leadership position, student must have served satisfactorily and fulfilled the responsibilities of that position

Biology Program

This scholarship fund was established by the faculty of San Diego Mesa College's Biology Department to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student majoring in a field of study in which Biological sciences are foundational, including biology majors, allied health majors (nursing, medicine, etc.), environmental science majors, etc., and who has achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of two Biology courses at Mesa College with a minimum grade point average of 3.0
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher

Braille Transcribers' Guild Scholarship for Visually Impaired Students

This scholarship fund was established by the Braille Transcribers' Guild to provide financial assistance to visually impaired students who are pursuing their educational goals at Mesa College.

To be eligible, a student must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 6 units at Mesa College
- Have a GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Must have demonstrated financial need

- Must be pursuing either an associate degree or certificate program
- Must submit a letter of verification of visual impairment from DSP&S at Mesa college or equivalent
- Must submit a letter of recommendation from a faculty member of Mesa College

California Coast Credit Union Scholarship

This scholarship fund was initially established by the California Coast Credit Union to recognize and provide financial assistance to deserving Mesa College students who have achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher
- Have a declared academic goal: A.A./A.S. Degree, Career Education, or Transfer

Catherine Larocca Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by the Mesa College School of Business, Computer Studies, and Technologies in memory of Professor Catherine Larocca. The scholarship was established to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student who has triumphed over obstacles in order to pursue their education.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Completed at least 12 units at Mesa College
- Demonstrated a GPA of at least 2.5
- Currently enrollment in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Demonstrated community involvement

Cesar Gonzalez

This scholarship fund was established by the faculty and staff of San Diego Mesa College to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student who has achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of one course in Chicano Studies at Mesa College

- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher
- Have a declared academic goal of transfer to a four year institution
- Maintain academic progress. Progress verified by counseling
- Have a leadership/service related to Chicanos/Latinos at Mesa College or in the community

Chancellor's Scholarship

The Chancellor's Scholarship has been established by the Mesa College Foundation to recognize students for academic excellence and exemplary service to the college and community.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 12 units at Mesa College
- Have completed at least 24 units at Mesa College.
- Must be a continuing student at Mesa in fall 2007 and spring 2008.
- Must be enrolled in at least 12 units in the Fall semester 2007 and 12 units in the Spring 2008 semester
- Have a Mesa College grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Must show evidence of leadership involvement and community service

Charles W. Patrick Scholarship

This scholarship was established in memory of the first Chancellor of the San Diego Community College District. Charles W. Patrick was a great leader who helped build the district, one building at a time. His efforts enabled the district to diversify in order to serve the community's educational needs. Two students from Mesa will be chosen; 1 planning to transfer to a 4-year college and 1 from a trade-oriented program not pursuing a 4-year degree.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Must actively participate in a community service organization.
- Must demonstrate a financial need

Chemistry Department

This scholarship fund was established by the faculty of San Diego Mesa College's

Chemistry department to recognize a deserving student majoring in Chemistry who has achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Have a declared major in one of the following chemical sciences: Chemistry; Biochemistry; Chemical Engineering; Pharmacy
- Be currently enrolled in or have completed Chemistry 201 and 201L
- Be currently enrolled at Mesa with a minimum of 6 units
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa
- Have a grade point average of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher

Child Development Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by the Child Development faculty to assist students who plan to become teachers of young children. This scholarship will recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student who is majoring in Child Development.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be a Child Development major
- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a SDCCD/Mesa College grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale

Classified Senate Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by the Board of Directors of the Mesa College Foundation to support classified staff in successfully achieving their educational goals. The scholarship fund is supported by donations from Mesa College staff and the Classified Senate.

To be eligible, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Be a contract classified employee at Mesa College for at least 1 year
- Be currently enrolled in at least 3 units at an accredited institution
- Have completed a minimum of 6 units
- Have a GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for courses completed

***You are NOT eligible if you have received a Classified Senate**

Scholarship within the past three (3) years.

Cochenille Fashion Computer Technology Award

This scholarship is sponsored by Cochenille Design Studio to recognize and provide financial assistance to a student who shows talent and scholarship in the area of computer graphics in the field of Fashion Design.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be enrolled in a least 6 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have completed or in process of completing a least 2 Fashion courses in computer graphics
- Have a GPA of 3.0 or higher for Mesa courses completed and a cum GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Have declared a major in Fashion

Cresencio and Kathryn Torres

This scholarship fund was established by Cresencio and Kathryn Torres to recognize and provide financial assistance to students majoring in Animal Health Technology who have achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 3.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher
- Have a declared major in Animal Health Technology

Cross Country Scholarship

This scholarship fund was initially established by the San Diego Track Club, to recognize and provide financial assistance to deserving students majoring in Physical Education who have achieved outstanding performance in Cross Country. (One \$500 scholarship will be awarded)

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Have completed a minimum of 2 intercollegiate sport seasons at Mesa College or have finished one complete season and be currently participating in a second
- Be currently enrolled in at least 12 units at Mesa College of which 9 units must be in courses other than Physical Education activity classes

- Have completed a minimum of 36 units at Mesa College or have completed 24 units and currently enrolled in 12 units or more
- Have a grade point average of 2.75 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Plan on continuing his/her education at a four-year college/university and have no plans for further intercollegiate competition at the community college level. **(Must return scholarship if they have any further community college intercollegiate participation due to state athletic eligibility rules regarding subsidization)**
- Have a declared academic goal: AA/AS with the purpose of transferring to a four year college or university

Devan Caddell Memorial Scholarship

The Devan Caddell Memorial scholarship was established by the San Diego Mesa College School of Physical Education, Health Education, Dance and Athletics in memory of Devan Caddell, a student-athlete who lost his life on November 6, 2007, in an auto accident on Hwy. 94. The scholarship is intended to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student majoring in Physical Education who has achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Have completed a minimum of 2 intercollegiate sport seasons at Mesa College or have finished one complete season and be currently participating in a second
- Be currently enrolled in at least 12 units at Mesa College of which 9 units must be in courses other than Physical Education activity classes
- Have completed a minimum of 36 units at Mesa College or have completed 24 units and currently enrolled in 12 units or more
- Have a grade point average of 2.75 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Plan on continuing his/her education at a four-year college/university and have no plans for further intercollegiate competition at the community college level. **(Must return scholarship if they have any further community college intercollegiate participation due to state athletic eligibility rules regarding subsidization)**
- Have a declared academic goal: AA/AS with the purpose of transferring to a four year college or university

Dietetic Service Supervisor

This scholarship fund was established by the faculty of San Diego Mesa College's Nutrition Dept., the Dietetic Service Supervisor Program Director, and the Advisory Committee to the Dietetic Service Supervisor Certificate Program, to recognize and provide financial assistance to students who have applied to the Dietetic Service Supervisor Certificate Program and who have achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership (Three \$500 scholarships will be awarded.)

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 1 course in the Dietetic Service Supervisor Certificate program at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of two courses in the Dietetic Service Supervisor Certificate program at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed and provide copy of official transcript of grades
- Have completed and submitted an application to the Dietetic Service Supervisor Certificate program

Don Prommas, M.D. Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by Donna Duchow in memory of her father, Don Prommas, M.D. This scholarship was established to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving non-U.S.-born student who is planning a career in medicine or a health-related field.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Born outside of the United States (verifying documentation, ie: passport, birth certificate, etc, required)
- Currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Declared educational plan in the field of medicine or a health-related field
- Demonstrated GPA of at least 3.0

Dr. Granville N. Moore Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by Professor Judy Sundayo in memory of her father, Dr. Granville N. Moore. Dr. Moore was a graduate of Meharry Medical School and was very proud to have provided medical care to the poor and unfortunate of Washington D.C. for over fifty years. This memorial scholarship has been established to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving underrepresented student who is interested in pursuing a career in medicine, dentistry, physical therapy or pharmacy and who believes in the importance in community service. Funds for this scholarship have been donated by Dr. Judy Sundayo.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 6 semester units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 24 semester units of college-level coursework
- Have a grade point average of 2.8 or higher
- Have completed an educational plan with a counselor
- Submit by the application deadline: (1) application, (2) educational plan, (3) community service letter, (4) essay and (5) letter of recommendation.

Elmer E. Specht, M.D. Memorial Scholarship

This memorial scholarship was established to honor the memory of a great husband, father, and surgeon; a man who dedicated his life to saving lives. In private practice, as medical school professor at UCSF and University of Oregon, and as an Orthopaedic surgeon at the Veteran's Hospital in Boise, Idaho he worked diligently to improve patient's lives. Dr. Specht volunteered his medical expertise to assist children at the Shriner's Burn Center in San Francisco and he worked with missionaries and at the leper colony in Panama to provide medical care for indigenous people. One \$300.00 award will be for book purchases at the Mesa College Bookstore.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be a second year student majoring in science at Mesa College
- Declared a major in a science field
- Must complete 18 units in science courses with a grade of A or B
- Demonstrated a GPA of at least 3.0

English Department Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by the faculty of San Diego Mesa College's English Department to recognize and provide financial assistance to deserving students who have achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Have completed 9 units of transfer-level English courses with a grade of "B" or higher.
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher

- Have a declared academic goal of transfer to a four year institution

EOPS Program

This scholarship fund was established by the EOPS Department of San Diego Mesa College in order to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving EOPS student currently in good standing with the program.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Be currently receiving services from the EOPS Program
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Enroll in 12 units for the upcoming **Fall semester** at Mesa College or in an accredited four year post-secondary academic institution. Verification of enrollment in 12 units for the **upcoming Fall Semester** will be required prior to release of award
- Maintain academic progress. Verification of academic progress from counselor will be required
- Must meet all of the requirements of the EOPS Mutual Responsibility Contract (MRC).

ESOL Scholarship

This Scholarship fund was established by the faculty of San Diego Mesa College's ESOL program to recognize and encourage their deserving students.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be enrolled in at least one ESOL course at Mesa College at time of application.
- Have completed at least 5 units in ESOL at Mesa College.
- Have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher in all ESOL courses taken.
- Have a goal to transfer to a four-year institution or attain an A.A. degree, but other vocational or personal goals as explained in the essay will be considered.

F.A.G.S & S.A. Scholarship Supplement

This scholarship fund was established by The Founding Executive Board of F.A.G.S & S.A. in 2008 and made possible by way of fund raising efforts within the club. This scholarship is intended to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student who represents the mission of F.A.G.S & S.A. in the

promotion of diversity and humanism at two-year colleges. This student has achieved outstanding scholarship, demonstrates leadership, possesses an interest in activism and has contributed to the community by serving others.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Demonstrate financial need
- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for SDCCD classes
- Be a current member of F.A.G.S & S.A. in good standing. If the applicant is an office holder, they must have completely fulfilled their duties
- Participated in F.A.G.S & S.A. and the community through: leadership, community service, and fellowship

Fashion Club- Fashion Design Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by the Fashion Club of San Diego Mesa College's Fashion Program to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student(s) majoring in Fashion Design who has achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of two Fashion courses at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 college level units
- Have a GPA of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Have a declared major in Fashion Design
- Have a minimum of one semester remaining before educational program completed, or documentation verifying that you are transferring to another school.

Fashion Club – Fashion Merchandising Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by the Fashion Club of San Diego Mesa College's Fashion Program to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student(s) majoring in Fashion Merchandising who has achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of two Fashion courses at Mesa

College

- Have completed a minimum of 12 college level units
- Have a GPA of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Have a declared major in Fashion Merchandising
- Have a minimum of one semester remaining before educational program completed, or documentation verifying that you are transferring to another school.

Fashion Program Scholarship

This scholarship fund was initially established by the faculty of San Diego Mesa College's Fashion Program to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student(s) majoring in fashion who has achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of two Fashion courses at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 college level units
- Have a GPA of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Have a declared major in Fashion
- Have a minimum of one semester remaining before educational program completed, or documentation verifying that you are transferring to another school.

Francis X. Gold Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by Mark Linsky in memory of Francis X. Gold, to recognize and provide financial assistance to a "mobility disabled" student who meets the eligibility requirements.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 6 units at one of the three colleges of the San Diego Community College District (Mesa, City, Miramar).
- Be pursuing an Associates Degree or be enrolled in a Certificate Program.
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units.
- Have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for all units completed

Gladys E. Carter Memorial Scholarship

The Gladys E. Carter Memorial Scholarship was established by the children of Gladys Carter in memory of their mother. She was extremely talented in the creative arts and strongly encouraged and supported others in their educational pursuits. This scholarship was established to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student who has an interest in Fashion.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Completed at least 12 units at Mesa College or any other accredited college
- Demonstrated a GPA of at least 2.2
- Completed at least one Fashion course, or completed at least one of the following: Art 150A, 150B, or 155A
- Demonstrated Community Service

Harry MacDonald Lighting Design Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by the Illuminating Engineering Society of San Diego to recognize and provide financial assistance to deserving students who are pursuing a career in lighting design, architecture, landscape architecture or interior design.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in a minimum of 3 credit units at Mesa College
- Have successfully completed a minimum of 9 credit units at Mesa College
- Have a declared major in lighting design, architecture, landscape architecture or interior design
- Have completed or enrolled in a lighting design course

Harvey T. Bergland Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by Dr. Yvonne Bergland, Dean of Instructional Service, Resource Development and Research in memory of her husband, Harvey T. Bergland. This scholarship was established to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student who is a music or fine art major.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Completed at least 12 units at Mesa College
- Be currently enrolled in, or have completed a minimum of 12 units in Music or Fine Arts
- Demonstrated academic excellence with a GPA of at least 3.0
- Have demonstrated community involvement

Interior Design Program

This scholarship was established by the faculty of San Diego Mesa College's Interior Design Program and funded by the program and the Student Chapter of ASID to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student majoring in Interior Design who has achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 3 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of two Interior Design courses at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed
- Have a declared major in Interior Design
- Have a minimum of one semester remaining before educational program completed, or documentation verifying that you are transferring to a four year university for BA

Interior Design Program/NKBA Scholarship

This scholarship was established and funded by the NKBA San Diego Chapter to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student majoring in Interior Design who has achieved outstanding scholarship and demonstrated an interest in Kitchen and Bath Design.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 3 units at Mesa College
- Have completed or currently be enrolled in INTE 200 / Advanced Residential Space Planning: Kitchens & Baths
- Have completed a minimum of 18 units in Interior Design courses at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed
- Have a declared major in Interior Design
- Have a minimum of one course remaining before educational program completed, or documentation verifying that you are transferring to a four year university for BA

Iranian-American Faculty Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by Iranian-American faculty and staff of San Diego Mesa College

2-3 Scholarships of \$400-\$500 each will be awarded in May 2008

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be full-time student of Iranian heritage at Mesa College
- Have an overall grade point average of 3.0
- Have demonstrated financial need
- At least one scholarship to be awarded to a student majoring in a program within the School of Math and Natural Sciences
- Preference will be given to international students who are not eligible for public sources of financial aid due to visa status
- Honors students may be ranked higher

John W. Conrad Ceramics Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by the faculty of San Diego Mesa College's Ceramics Program to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student majoring in Art who has achieved outstanding scholarship, creative potential, and leadership.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Have a declared major of Art
- Be currently enrolled with 3 units or more at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 semester units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 6 semester units in Ceramics at Mesa College
- Have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Have a grade point average of 2.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed
- Be working towards a degree to an accredited two-year or four-year institution

Juan Manuel Aviles Memorial Scholarship for Nonresident Immigrant Students

Juan Manuel Aviles was an immigrant who left his native Nicaragua with the sole intent of providing better educational opportunities for his children. He believed deeply in the idea that "education is a great equalizer". He taught his children that every person has the opportunity to make a difference by becoming educated and giving back to society.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

Hispanic AB540 Nonresident Students with a 2.5 G.P.A. or higher.

Title 5, Section 54045.5 and the California Education Code of Regulations and Education Code Section 68130.5 defines AB540 Nonresident students as those who meet four specified requirements be exempted from the payment of nonresident tuition. Those requirements are:

1. High school attendance in California for three or more years;
2. Graduation from a California high school or attainment of the equivalent thereof;
3. Registration as an entering student, or current enrollment at an accredited institution of higher education in California, not earlier than the fall semester or quarter of the 2001-02 academic year; and
4. In the case of a person without lawful immigration status, the filing of an affidavit with the institution of higher education stating that the student has filed an application to legalize his or her immigration status, or will file an application as soon as he or she is eligible to do so.

Larry Schwartz Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by the faculty members of American Federations of Teachers of the San Diego Community College District to honor the memory and contributions to education and unionism of Larry Schwartz (1932-1955): history professor, labor organizer, a founder and long-time president of the American Federation of Teachers, and political activist. It is awarded to members, former members, or children of members of a union who are pursuing their education.

To be eligible, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a GPA of 2.8 or better on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and a cumulative GPA of 2.8 or higher
- Be a labor union member in good standing, a former member with an honorable withdrawal card, or the son or daughter of a member in good standing

Learning Resource Center (LRC)

This scholarship fund was established by the Faculty and Staff of San Diego Mesa College's Learning Resource Center to recognize and provide financial assistance to deserving students who have achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and cumulative grade point

- average of 3.0 or higher
- Have a declared academic goal

Marcy Courtney Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by Sally Murdock and Joyce LaFleur in memory of Marcy Courtney. Marcy was a graduate of the Medical Assisting Program. This scholarship was established to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student who is either a medical assisting major or a student planning a career as a registered nurse and/or nurse practitioner. Funds for this scholarship have been donated by Sally Murdock, Nurse Practitioner and Joyce LaFleur, Medical Assistant as well as friends and family of Marcy Courtney.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in a least 9 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 15 units with an emphasis in Medical Assisting or pre-nursing
- Have a GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Have a declared major in Medical Assisting or a declared academic goal of transfer to a four year institution with a major in nursing

Margaret Katz Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established by Kathleen Fennessey in memory of her mother, Margaret Katz. This scholarship was established to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student who is actively involved in community service/volunteer work. To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Demonstrated a GPA of at least 2.0
- Declared academic goal of transfer to a four year institution
- Currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Completed at least 12 units at Mesa College
- Demonstrated community involvement

Marianne Jennifer Evans Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by Irene Evans in memory of her daughter, Marianne Jennifer Evans. This scholarship was established to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student who is actively involved in environmental planning, preservation, protection, and/or conservation. Funds for this scholarship have been donated by friends and family of Marianne Evans as well

as Mesa College and SDCCD staff and administration.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Have a declared academic goal of transfer to a four year institution
- Have completed at least 18 units at Mesa College and at least 6 units in Geology, Geography or Meteorology alone or in combination
- Demonstrated academic excellence with a GPA of at least 3.0
- Have demonstrated community involvement in Environmental Protection/Preservation

Marianne Jennifer Evans Memorial Scholarship for Disabled Students

Student must be receiving services from the Disabled Students Programs and Services Department

Matthew & Marion Dietschman Scholarship

This scholarship is funded by the Matthew and Marion Dietschman Education Fund in order to provide financial assistance to a student pursuing nursing or medical degrees who has achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 9 units at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher
- Have a declared major in any of the Allied Health Programs: Dental Assisting, Health Information Technology, Medical Assisting, Physical Therapy or Radiologic Technology.

Maximilian Memorial Scholarship (For Animal Health Technology Majors)

This scholarship fund was established by anonymous donors to recognize and provide financial assistance to students majoring in Animal Health Technology who have achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units in the Animal Health Technology program.

- Have a grade point average of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher
- Have a declared major in Animal Health Technology
- Have not received this scholarship twice
- You are ineligible if you have at least a BA or BS unless you are changing careers

Medical Assisting Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by the faculty of San Diego Mesa College's Medical Assisting Department to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student majoring in Medical Assisting who has achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 2 Medical Assisting courses at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher
- Have a declared major in Medical Assisting

Mesa Academy Program Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by the Mesa Academy Program in the Counseling Department in order to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving Mesa Academy student currently in good standing.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in 12 units at Mesa College (Students transferring Winter or Spring Quarter through Transfer Admission Guarantee or Spring Semester through Transfer Studies Degree are still eligible)
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a student education plan completed by the Counselor of the Mesa Academy Program. Educational plan must demonstrate work towards an Associates, Certificate, or Transfer
- Have completed English 101 or 205 and Personal Growth 120, 127, 130 or 140 with a grade of "B" or better
- Have an on-going Mentoring relationship with a Mesa College Faculty or Staff

- Have a GPA of 2.5 or better

Mesa College Foundation Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by the Board of Directors of the Mesa College Foundation to support and assist students in successfully achieving their educational goals. The scholarship fund is supported by donations from the Mesa College faculty, staff and administrators, community members, external organizations, San Diego Community College District staff and administrators, and various Mesa College corporate partners and friends.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Plan to register at Mesa College in the fall 2008 semester in at least 9 semester units
- Current enrollment in at least 9 units at Mesa College as a continuing student
- **Prior** completion of a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale for San Diego Community College District courses completed
- Demonstrated financial need—Financial need must be documented by completing the attached ***Financial Statement***

Scholarship award will be released upon verification of enrollment in 6 units for the Fall 2008 semester.

Michael Murphy Memorial Architecture and Environmental Design Scholarship

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

Murl Gibson Counseling Department Scholarship

To be eligible, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a GPA of 2.0 or better on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher
- Have on file an official Educational Plan and be working toward one of the following: Certificate, Associate Degree and/or Transfer Program

Peterson Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by George and Evelyn Peterson to recognize and provide financial assistance to deserving Mesa College students who have achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Plan to enroll in at least 6 units at Mesa College in Fall 2008
- Be currently enrolled in 6 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 6 units at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed
- Documented verification of Community Service

Scholarship award will be released upon verification of enrollment in 6 units for the Fall 2008 semester.

Physical Education/Athletics Program

Physical Sciences Department Scholarship

- Have completed a minimum of 5 units at Mesa College in the following disciplines: physics, engineering, astronomy, geology, physical science (general)
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher

President's Award for Academic Excellence and Service

The President's Award for Academic Excellence and Service Scholarship is the culminating and most prestigious Mesa College Foundation Scholarship award. It has been established to recognize recipients for achieving academic excellence and performing exemplary service to the college and community.

To be eligible, for the Academic Achievement and Leadership Award, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 12 units at Mesa College

(Students who are enrolled in remaining requirements for AA/AS degree, but less than 12 units, may be considered. A letter from an academic counselor is required).

- Have completed at least 24 units at Mesa College
- Have a Mesa College grade point average of 3.5 or higher on 4.0 scale
- Be transferring to a four year college/university to pursue a Baccalaureate degree
- Expect to graduate or complete transfer program by August 2008

Psi Beta Honor Society Psychology Scholarship

This scholarship was established by Joseph and Rowena Jang for student members of Psi Beta, the National Honor Society for Psychology. This scholarship is intended to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student who represents the mission of Psi Beta in the promotion of psychology at two-year colleges. This student has achieved outstanding scholarship, demonstrates leadership, possesses an interest in research and has contributed to the community by serving others.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 3.2 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed, and cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher
- Have a declared major in Psychology or demonstrates a genuine interest in the field
- Be a current member of Psi Beta in good standing
- Participated in Psi Beta through: leadership, community service, and promoting/conducting research

Puente Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by the Puente Club of San Diego Mesa College in order to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving current or past Puente student currently in good academic standing.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled at least 12 units at Mesa College
- Have completed, or is currently, participating in the Puente Program

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Demonstrated community involvement

Have demonstrated financial need – Financial need must be documented by completing the attached **Financial Statement**

Richard & Eloise Johnston Health Services Scholarship

One \$500 Scholarship will be awarded to a student who has been accepted into a health-related program at Mesa College.

Criteria and Requirements

- Student must have an interest in pursuing a career in a health-related field such as: nursing, radiologic technology, dental assisting or emergency medical technology.

- Student must maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher and must maintain good academic progress to sustain the scholarship.
- Demonstrate financial need.
- Must have the application signed by a clinical supervisor, or a faculty member in a health service program

Rita Sanchez and Richard Griswold del Castillo Scholarship

This scholarship fund is established to encourage Mesa College students to transfer to San Diego State University's Chicana/o Studies Department. It recognizes and provides financial assistance to students who intend to develop their knowledge and commitment o Chicana/o Studies as a major.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled as a student at Mesa College with at least 6 units.
- Be completing an Associate Degree or a transfer program in Spring semester with application to San Diego State University as a declared major in Chicana/o Studies.
- Have completed a minimum of 6 units as preparation for the major in Chicana and Chicano Studies.
- Have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed.

Robert W. Ball Biology Department Scholarship Award

- Have a GPA of 3.0 in Art classes and a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher in courses completed at San Diego Mesa College.
- Have a declared Art major or minor in any media.
- Artwork must have been completed within the last two years.

Ruth Kern Scholarship for Business, Computer Studies, and Technologies Students

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Must demonstrate a financial

Southland Technology, Inc Scholarship for Graduates of Morse High School or Lincoln High School in San Diego

This scholarship fund was established by Southland Technology, Inc. to recognize and provide financial assistance to deserving Mesa College students who graduated from Morse High School or Lincoln High School in San Diego and will be transferring to an accredited four year institution.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled at Mesa College
- Have applied for transfer to an accredited four year institution
- Have a minimum grade point average of 2.5
- Have graduated from Morse High School or Lincoln High School in San Diego.

Student Tutorial and Academic Resources (STAR) Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by the STAR Program of San Diego Mesa College in order to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving STAR student currently in good standing with the program.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently receiving services from the STAR Program
- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Have a declared academic goal of transfer to a four-year institution
- Have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale

Therapy Specialists Scholarship For Physical Therapist Assistant

This scholarship fund was established by Therapy Specialists, a private practice specializing in occupational, physical, and speech therapies to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student majoring in Physical Therapy Assisting who has achieved outstanding scholarship and leadership.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Have successfully completed the first year of courses in the Physical Therapist Assistant Program at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed
- Have a declared major in Physical Therapy Assisting

Track & Field Scholarship

This scholarship fund was initially established by the San Diego Track Club, to recognize and provide financial assistance to deserving students who have achieved

outstanding performance in Track and Field.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Have completed a minimum of 2 intercollegiate sport seasons at Mesa College or have finished one complete season and be currently participating in a second
- Be currently enrolled in at least 12 units at Mesa College of which 9 units must be in courses other than Physical Education activity classes
- Have completed a minimum of 36 units at Mesa College or have completed 24 units and currently enrolled in 12 units or more
- Have a grade point average of 2.75 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Plan on continuing his/her education at a four-year college/university and have no plans for further intercollegiate competition at the community college level. **(Must return scholarship if they have any further community college intercollegiate participation due to state athletic eligibility rules regarding subsidization)**
- Have a declared academic goal: AA/AS with the purpose of transferring to a four year college or university

Val and Ron Ontell Future Teacher Scholarship

This scholarship fund has been established by Val and Ron Ontell faculty members of Mesa College to provide financial support for students who are intending to pursue courses of study leading to a California Teaching Credentials or Librarian. The scholarship may be used for general expenses such as books, supplies, parking, etc.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Have declared intention of becoming a teacher or librarian on any educational level
- Be currently enrolled at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 12 semester units at Mesa College
- Have a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
- Be working toward a degree or transfer program to an accredited four-year institution

Violet Little Flower Clark Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by the family of Violet Little Flower Clark. as a memorial to her full life and the American Indian Studies Program at San

Diego Mesa College to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student of American Indian ancestry who has shown scholarship and leadership potential. (One \$250 Scholarship will be awarded. If funding permits, two will be funded).

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 9 units at San Diego Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of one course in American Indian/Native American Studies at a regionally accredited college or university.
- Have completed a minimum of 12 semester units (or equivalent) regionally accredited college or university.
- Have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale for college courses completed
- Have a declared academic goal of transfer to a four year institution
- Maintain academic progress. Progress verified by counseling
- Have leadership/service related to American Indians at Mesa College or in the community

Whitney M. Young Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by San Diego Mesa College in memory of 19-year-old student Whitney Young who died at the hands of a hit-and-run driver before fulfilling her desire to become a teacher. This scholarship is intended to recognize and provide financial assistance to deserving students who are pursuing a career in child development, teaching and/or related fields involving children.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Current enrollment in a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Successful completion of a minimum of 12 units at Mesa College
- Interest in pursuing a career in child development, education, or field related to working with children, e.g., child psychologist
- Have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses
- Current involvement working/volunteering in a position relating to children

William J. Agnello Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by Joseph and Joan Agenllo in memory of their son William J. Agnello (Billy). This scholarship was established to recognize

and provide financial assistance to a deserving student who is a business or science major.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Business or Science student
- Completed at least 12 units at Mesa College
- Demonstrated academic excellence with a GPA of at least 3.0
- Currently enrolled in at least 9 units at Mesa College
- Demonstrated community and/or college activities involvement

Yvette C. Rozier Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by Carletta Middleton and Mildred Rozier in memory of daughter and sister, Yvette C. Rozier. This scholarship was established to recognize and provide financial assistance to a deserving student who is actively involved in community service/volunteer work. Funds for this scholarship have been donated by friends and family of Yvette C. Rozier.

To be eligible, students must meet the following criteria:

- Currently enrolled in at least 12 units at Mesa College
- Declared academic goal of transfer to a four year institution
- Completed at least 12 units at Mesa College
- Demonstrated a GPA of at least 2.5
- Demonstrated community/college activities involvement

Zae Winter Foundation Scholarship

This scholarship is funded by the Zae Winter Foundation at The San Diego Foundation in order to provide financial assistance to students pursuing nursing, health science or medical degrees.

To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in at least 6 units at Mesa College
- Have completed a minimum of 20 units at Mesa College
- Have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale for Mesa College courses completed
- Have a declared major in any of the Allied Health Programs: Dental Assisting, Health Information Technology, Medical Assisting, Physical Therapy or Radiologic Technology
