- d) Pegah PATH just submitted a request for a reiteration of funding through Mellon Foundation. Careers in the Arts is one of the three areas in the grant. Cross-district/cross campus collaboration. We may be able to dive into that.
- e) Blythe the scavenger hunt idea came out of NFI because people felt it was too competitive and too westernized so that's why we don't do it any more. But perhaps we could do it where outside of each dept. there is a photo, a blurb about the dept. and perhaps a QR code or something that you scan to prove you went there. Then if you get all the areas, then you get some money or a gift card or prize?
- f) Jenny let's make the students actually have to come in and find it so they have to look through the space, not outside. Engage more.
- g) George scan the qr code then answer questions?
- Pegah could we get it so that everyone can get the reward if they complete it? Perhaps include the parents (help encourage parent support).
- i) Jenny we just did our ART open house; we didn't get to promote it as much as we wanted. We were hoping to reach out to highschools/prospective students. Very difficult to do this on our own. If we teamed up and did an arts night open house, perhaps it would be more helpful; we would have more resources?
- j) Blythe Donna has done a great job for Dance we have a few highschool days a year... we get groups from 20-60 students from highschool come to visit for a day or part of a day. We have a series of 3 activities they do/engagements. Then a little "share your art" then they bring their own lunches and pay us to do it. We ask for about \$12-\$15/student. Usually on a Friday. - k) Donna we get students to enroll because of this. We also have students participate in some of our dances and then the parents come and see them and the program and support.
- I) Jenny could we also do it where it wasn't so arranged but just open and anyone who wanted to could come?
- m) Blythe yes, but what we've seen is that people aren't coming to things any more. What we did in dance is we moved our dress rehearsal to fit in the Mesa school schedule time blocks. Then we emailed all the students who had a class during that time and invited them to bring their classes.
- n) Jenny this was pre-Covid, we also had luck going out into the community. Perhaps artwalk in liberty station?
- o) George this would be great get out into the community and promoting our programs.

 - a) George I support this especially since some of the poets are getting paid; it's an equity issue/ we should compensate them for their time and effort.

 - c) Blythe yes, go for it.
