**A. There are currently three (3) statewide initiatives:**

1. Online Education Initiative (OEI)
2. Common Assessment Initiative
3. Education Planning Initiative

**B. Online Education Initiative (OEI):**

1. "Canvas" Platform: OEI adopted "Canvas" as the platform/common course management system (CCMS).
  - a. Eight (8) colleges are participating in a pilot program and 31 other colleges have agreed to adopt Canvas.
- 2: The San Diego Community College District will need to do the following in order to join the OEI California Exchange:
  - a. Adopt Canvas. (SDCCD renewed our Blackboard subscription for two more years at a 50% discount and we will test the new Blackboard Ultra.)
  - b. Have CCCApply (<http://home.cccapply.org/>). (Not implemented yet - May be implemented in Fall 2016)
  - c. Our courses must have C-ID course numbers. (SDCCD courses are still waiting for C-ID approvals)
  - d. Our online classes must be reviewed by OEI trained reviewers.
  - e. Our Faculty must have at least two years of experience teaching online before they are added to the exchange.
  - f. Faculty must be certified locally or through @ONE (<http://www.onefortraining.org/>).
- 3: The SDCCD will not be ready to enroll in the exchange until our Student Information System (ISIS) migrates to the Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) System.
- 4: The SDCCD will only put some of our online courses on the California OEI Exchange.
- 5: Articulation Officer Juliette Parker asked if limits will be placed on the number of students from outside our region who can enroll in SDCCD courses to allow students in our region the opportunity to enroll in our classes.
- 6: Kim Perigo asked what happens if we are not part of the OEI California Exchange.
- 7: The Mesa College Distance Education Committee will report to the Senate about the relative merits of "Canvas" and "Blackboard Ultra".

  - a. The act encourages Faculty to accelerate the adoption of lower cost, high-quality open educational resources.

	<b>A. Proposed National University Memorandum of Understanding (MOU):</b> Mesa College MOU Committee Members Articulation Officer Juliette Parker and Transfer Center Coordinator Leroy Johnson		
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The District Instructional Services Office abandoned the established San Diego Community College District (SDCCD) process for developing MOUs when this proposed National University MOU was developed.</li> <li>2. The Mesa College MOU Committee's general issues with the proposal are as follows: as reported by Juliette Parker             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. The National University MOU proposal does not appear to align with our mission in establishing MOUs related to transfer.                     <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The goal in establishing an agreement is to benefit our students in ways than do not already exist through the normal transfer and/or admission process.</li> </ul> </li> <li>b. The overall goal of the proposal appears to be more about marketing.</li> <li>c. The proposed MOU compromises Mesa College's current goal of not providing special standing to National University or any other institution.</li> <li>d. Many elements of the proposal are already being accommodated by Mesa.                     <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Other elements are those which students can participate in without MOUs.</li> </ul> </li> <li>e. The "Reverse Transfer Credit" proposal does not align with our current acceptance and use of credit policy.                     <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Reverse transfer appears to guarantee acceptance and use of credit without evaluation.</li> <li>• National University frequently changes their curriculum during the same academic year which would appear to, even more so, warrant greater scrutiny of Nationals' courses by the San Diego Community College District (SDCCD).</li> </ul> </li> <li>f. Through the reverse transfer effort, it appears that students would pay a higher cost to obtain an SDCCD associate degree.</li> </ol> </li> <li>3. Shannon Shi reported that the Languages Department Faculty members met and agreed that the quality of the proposed MOU is poor.</li> <li>4. Mesa College President Pam Luster sent out a proposal last Friday that was revised by City and Miramar.             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Although Mesa is listed in the revision, Mesa did not have input in the revisions proposed.</li> <li>b. The Mesa College MOU Committee will ask the Senate to review the revised proposal this semester.</li> </ol> </li> <li>5. Juliette and Leroy intend to meet with National University representatives to clarify their goals for a MOU with Mesa College.             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Additional MOU revisions will be recommended by Mesa.</li> </ol> </li> </ol>

The ADT is a watered down associates degree.</li> </ol> </li> <li>2. The Senators agreed that changes need to be made to the current version of the resolution.</li> </ol>

The resolution requests that Faculty members have the option of selecting a laptop computer when it is time for their computers to be replaced to use during their classes, conferences, meetings and other work related activities.</li> <li>2. AFT President Jim Mahler informed Lou Ann that the Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) gives the district the ability to select the type of computer it provides Faculty.</li> </ol>
