- Annual program fee \$5000 per year (2024, 2025, and 2026)

- Stipends for 6 mentors and counselor
- Faculty and student travel to Summit (2024 and 2026)
- Stipend for former Mesa student (current UCLA law student) to develop and deliver LSAT workshop
- Guest speakers and events



Overview of the pathway at Mesa







Data on student participation and completion













Data on student participation and completion

Started collecting demographic data in fall 2023


Participation - does our program reach student populations on an equitable basis? Students in our program (spr and fall 25) vs students at Mesa






Data on student participation and completion
