ACCJC Follow-Up Site Visit Successfully Concluded

We are pleased to share that the ACCJC Follow-Up Site Visit successfully concluded on October 27.

During the visit, our Mesa team had the opportunity to present to the ACCJC Peer Review Team how we have addressed the two ACCJC requirements regarding outcomes assessment, remained in compliance, and built systems, tools, and processes that embed this work into our institutional culture.

A team of 11 Mesa representatives participated in the presentation to ensure the ACCJC team heard directly from the people who have been closest to this work over the past 1.5 years. Together, they shared how our collective efforts have strengthened alignment, consistency, and accountability across the college.

We are proud of what we accomplished and how we worked together to tell Mesa's story of collective action and impact. We look forward with optimism to the Commission's final decision, expected in January 2026.

We extend heartfelt thanks to our presenters, Mary Gwin and Mandy Johnston, and to the entire Mesa team who came well-prepared to represent our campus so thoughtfully and passionately.

Employee Housing Survey

The District is moving forward with plans to open its first affordable student housing at City College in fall 2028 and is exploring similar options at Mesa, Miramar, and the College of Continuing Education. In addition, the District is researching partnerships with local developers to expand affordable housing opportunities for employees. These partnerships would not involve District-owned or -operated housing and would not be tied to employment. Fall 2025 Update

As we move into the second half of the semester, our second eight-week session enrollment has stabilized to account for instructor and student drops. These drops occurred for multiple reasons, to include addressing any fraudulent actors in the system. This explains the slight dip in headcount which is now at 21,374 versus 21,574 from the same time last week. We are still over our enrollment targets for this semester by 2.8% with an FTES of 6,135. We anticipate very minimal changes at this point to our fall 2025 enrollment numbers. We will begin to examine 2026 Intersession and Spring enrollment activity as priority groups start next week.

Federal Shutdown Impact on CalFresh

The federal shutdown that began October 1 has delayed CalFresh benefits, leaving over **400,000 San Diegans** temporarily without food assistance. This pause represents **\$73 million** in delayed aid and **\$130.6 million** in lost local economic activity.

What to Know

- Only November benefits are delayed at this time eligibility and enrollment continue.
- Students should still apply for CalFresh.
- The Stand's Fresh Success Program remains unaffected for now.
- Benefits will be **issued retroactively** once the government reopens.

• CalWORKs and Medi-Cal are not currently impacted.

How can I apply for an Innovation Grant? Submit a completed application form—found here—no later than 11:59 pm on Friday, November 7, 2025.

There are three steps to applying: 1) draft your content; 2) request letters of support from your Dean and VP; 3) submit your application for approval. For details...

Pro Tip: Be sure to get an early start to allow time for gathering necessary approvals: the Dean and Vice President of your department must approve your application by the deadline. (Don't worry, this is explained in the application!)

How do I fill out my application?

Use our step-by-step guide to applying for an Innovation Grant—found *here*. Reach out to MesaGrantAdmin@sdccd.edu if you have any additional questions!

Step 1: Download and fill out the application practice template—found here. Consult with your Dean and Vice President during this process.

Step 2: Request letters of support from your Dean and VP. You may use the letter templates available here: https://bit.ly/InnovationGrants26_VP_Letter

Step 3: Fill out and submit the online application <u>here</u>. We ask that you do this in one sitting because you cannot save your work.

Step 4: Your application is completely submitted! Decisions will be announced in late December or early January.

Does my idea qualify?

The Mesa College Foundation focuses on projects that 1) positively impact student success, 2) align with Mesa's strategic goals, and 3) deliver innovation. Stipends/salary for staff are not eligible expenses.
