Mesa's Second Baccalaureate Degree Is Approved



Dear Mesa Community,

I am thrilled to share wonderful news with you.

San Diego Mesa College has received **full approval** to move forward with our **Physical Therapy Assistant Baccalaureate Degree**. On February 6, 2026, our provisionally approved program was formally approved, clearing the way for us to launch this new four-year degree.

Our Physical Therapy Assistant four-year degree expands an affordable, place-based pathway closely aligned with regional workforce needs. It allows students to pursue high-demand careers without leaving their community or taking on unsustainable debt. In doing so, we advance social mobility, strengthen our local health workforce, and live into our equity-centered mission in a very tangible way.


This achievement reflects the very best of Mesa College: faculty expertise, staff dedication, administrative leadership, and a shared commitment to creating opportunities that change lives.



Enrollment Update

As we enter the second week of the Spring 2026 semester, we continue to remain ahead of our enrollment goals. Our current headcount is 21,400 which is an additional 103 new students enrolling into a course/s. Last year at the same point of the Spring 2025 semester, our headcount was 21,317, so we are continuing to see a slight increase in the number of students. Our FTES is 6,058 with a productivity of 15.40. As students may be adjusting schedules and we explore second 8-week course opportunities, FTES will continue to toggle slightly in the coming weeks up to Census.



Global Game Jam

Mesa College successfully hosted its fourth annual Global Game Jam from January 30–February 1 in the Business and Technology Building, bringing together more than 50 students, alumni, and local developers for an intensive 48-hour game-development experience. This year's global theme, "**MASK**," inspired teams to explore new creative directions in storytelling, design, and rapid prototyping.

The event continues to strengthen Mesa College's role as a hub for innovation in San Diego's growing game-development community. Students gained hands-on experience completing fully scoped, portfolio-ready game projects while learning essential lessons in managing project scope within a 48-hour development cycle. They also benefited from meaningful networking opportunities with professionals, hobbyists, and peers from other institutions. For the broader community, the Jam served as a unifying milestone event that brings together students, industry professionals, and enthusiasts, establishing Mesa College as a



gathering place that supports future activities such as lectures, demo days, and portfolio reviews. Mesa also benefits from increased visibility among hobbyists and professionals who gain awareness of the value of our academic and continuing education offerings.

Mesa's partnership with the **International Game Developers Association – San Diego (IGDA-SD)** remains central to the Jam's success. As a volunteer-run organization committed to supporting aspiring and professional developers, IGDA-SD helps foster a safe, inclusive, and diverse creative environment. Their collaboration with Mesa amplifies the college's mission by expanding professional networks, promoting educational pathways, and elevating Mesa as a community meeting ground for events such as lectures, demo days, and portfolio reviews.

Across its years at Mesa, the Global Game Jam and the Fall San Diego Game Jam have become signature events that deepens community engagement, supports workforce-aligned learning, and showcases the creativity and ambition of Mesa students. 

BOND PROJECTS UPDATE 02/06/2026

Mesa College Athletics Complex

Weekly coordination with campus stakeholders continues to refine core program standards and identify space efficiencies across all athletics programs, with this week's discussions focused on the aquatics program and stadium needs, including seating configuration, access, and press box requirements. In addition, the student engagement workshop held on February 4 welcomed more than 150 student-athletes, generating strong participation and overwhelmingly positive feedback.

Mesa College Performing Arts Center/Administration & Parking Structure

Program requirements for the Mesa College Performing Arts Center, Administration building, and Parking Structure continue to be developed in collaboration with campus leadership and stakeholders, while cost details are being refined with the Design-Build Entity. This work includes evaluating expanded parking capacity in preparation for the upcoming Additional Funding Request. Preparation of the request form is underway, with submission to the District anticipated in mid-February 2026.

Mesa College Design Center Improvements

Met this week with the Design Center Dean and faculty to begin coordinating construction activities tentatively scheduled for late 2026 to early 2027. Exact start dates will be confirmed with campus input.

Mesa College Baseball Home-Run Netting Installation

Steel columns are currently in fabrication and are expected to be installed within the next few weeks. To minimize impacts to athletics operations, the fence will be reinstalled in its existing configuration during home games to protect the baseball warning track, and temporarily relocated on non-game days to accommodate ongoing construction activities.
