Dear Mesa College Community,

I am thrilled to share some wonderful news with you.

San Diego Mesa College's accreditation has been reaffirmed by the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC).

At its January 14–15, 2026, meeting, the ACCJC reviewed our Follow-Up Report, supporting evidence, and the Peer Review Team Follow-Up Report from the October 27, 2025, visit. After careful consideration, the Commission determined that Mesa College has fully addressed the previously identified deficiencies, corrected compliance requirements, and meets the applicable accreditation standards. As a result, our accreditation has been reaffirmed for the remainder of the cycle.

This is an important milestone, and it reflects the sustained commitment, integrity, and collective effort of our entire campus community. Accreditation is never the work of a single office or group. It is the result of shared responsibility across faculty, classified professionals, administrators, students, and our broader partners, all grounded in our commitment to student learning, equity, and institutional effectiveness.

The Commission also expressed appreciation for the diligent work and thoughtful reflection undertaken by San Diego Mesa College, affirming that peer review remains a powerful process for strengthening quality and effectiveness in higher education.

In accordance with ACCJC requirements, we are sharing the following documents with our campus community and the public:

- The Follow-Up Report, 2025
- The Peer Review Team Follow-Up Report, 2026
- The ACCJC Action Letter, 2026

These materials have been posted on the College [Accreditation website](#).

Looking ahead, our next milestone will be the **Midterm Report due March 15, 2028**, followed by our next comprehensive review cycle beginning with the ISER review in fall 2030 and concluding with a focused site visit in spring 2031.

Today, though, we pause to celebrate. This reaffirmation reflects who we are as a college: reflective, accountable, student-centered, and deeply committed to equity, excellence and continuous improvement. Thank you for the care, collaboration, and persistence you bring to this work every day.

Congratulations, Mesa College. This moment belongs to all of us.

San Diego Mesa College has a clear, coordinated Immigration Enforcement Response Plan centered on our Emergency Management Response Team, led by the President and including College Communications, Vice Presidents, Facilities and Operations, OEHS, and the Campus Community Emergency Response Team, in coordination with SDCCD Police. Enrollment Update

Spring 2026 is off to a strong start with our headcount at 21,297 individual students taking a class or classes with us this semester. Our FTES is 6,057 and productivity is at 15.41. Last year, at the start of Spring 2025, our headcount was 21,216 and our FTES was 6,072. We are on pace to have a slight FTES increase from spring-to-spring semester and a more significant overall FTES increase when comparing 2024-2025 to the 2025-2026 academic year.


